**THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK**

***From Hymn StF No. 16 9 “Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free, from our fears and sins release us, let us find our rest in thee.... Born thy people to deliver, born a child and yet a king.”***

This well-known hymn by Charles Wesley is used to celebrate Advent or “the Coming” of the One promised down the centuries of the old testament by prophets and priests. One of many texts, Jeremiah33:16b, says ‘The name by which he will be called is “The Lord our righteousness.” Today (28<sup>th</sup>) is Advent 1 or the first Sunday in Advent.

Advent is the period in the church calendar when we are urged to prepare our hearts and minds to journey spiritually towards Bethlehem and the events which culminate in the birth of the Christchild, remembered annually throughout the world as Christmas Day.

Christmastide is considered the Season of Goodwill. It is a time when folk exchange happy greetings with others, via cards, the internet, telephone, or in person. It gives a warm feeling when out walking and a stranger replies to your “Merry Christmas!”. I am always saddened that the ‘goodwill’ often fails to last beyond Boxing Day.

Some people love Christmas, others find it stressful, even a time of sadness, especially if they have lost a loved one at that time. Still others take the view that it is too commercialised; but we have to consider that it is the period in the trading year when many enterprises do the most business; and is essential to their survival. Hence Black Friday and all the offers tempting us at present.

To make a play on words we use the present time to find a present to give to each of our loved ones to celebrate the presence amongst us of the One, as Wesley says, ‘born to be King.’

The coming of the Christchild, the man born to be King of our lives, yet also born to die for our redemption, is something for which we should be profoundly thankful. It changed the course of history, and the person of Jesus still transforms lives, and situations, as his kingdom comes into the hearts and minds of those who put their trust in him.

So amidst all of the preparations, expense, frustrations, excitement, and over-indulgence, when we wrap and open presents we receive, let’s recall the greatest gift of all, Jesus, Son of God, Emmanuel – God with us. Every blessing, *John*.
