FINANCIAL SITUATION OF OUR CHURCH.

The new financial year has not started well for our church. Indeed things started to go wrong back in April when the decorator started to repaint the outside of the building. It soon became clear that the woodwork was in poor health and a carpenter was called in to repair and replace much of the window frames on the Stratford Road side of the building. This added a further £1478 to the budgeted cost of repainting. When the carpenter opened three of the windows the whole frame fell out, that's how rotten they were. Unfortunately the carpenter was not able to build new frames or repair the old ones. An emergency decision was made to replace the three windows with PVC double glazed windows at a cost of £2222 inc VAT and fitting. The windows to be replaced are the office, room 2 and the ground floor ladies toilet.

The heating system boiler was serviced at the end of August and it is fit and well! However, the same cannot be said for the flue to the boiler, this is very poorly and needs to be replaced. Until this is done the heating system remains shut down. The estimated cost of this replacement is £2900.

These three emergency items total £6600. If that wasn't enough, the Circuit Assessment has been increased by 5% and added a further £2219 per annum to our contribution to the Circuit.

I hope you will understand why I feel it necessary at this time to invite you all to consider increasing your regular giving to the life and work of this Church and Centre. I do understand that many of you are already giving as much as you can, if so please don't be concerned if you really cannot give any more. Thank you. *Sheila Sharman, Church Treasurer.*
