THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK: – ADVENT

Today (30th) is Advent 1 or the first Sunday in Advent. Advent is the important season in the liturgical calendar culminating in the celebration of the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ on Christmas Day.

It is also the period when we are urged to prepare our hearts and minds to journey spiritually towards Bethlehem where we witness once again the nativity story and all that it means to us.

As we share the story with others it is an opportunity to “put Christ back into Christmas”. Some take the view that Christmas is too commercialised, although we have to consider that it is the period in the trading year when many enterprises do the most business. We can use the present time, to find a present to give our loved ones, to celebrate the presence among us of the One “born a child, yet a King”. Why presents? To

commemorate the gifts to the baby Jesus of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

In our material preparations let us also remember some find Christmas stressful, even a time of sadness if they have lost a loved one at this time, are alone, or struggling financially. However, the coming of the Christchild, the one born to die for our redemption, is something for which we should be profoundly thankful. It changed history, and the person of Jesus still transforms lives, and situations, as his kingdom comes into the hearts and minds of those who put their trust in him.

So, when we wrap and open presents we exchange, let’s recall the greatest gift of all, Jesus, Son of God, Emmanuel - God with us. *Every blessing, John Webb*
